- A) <u>classify</u> factors and information from the interview into the following aspects of wellbeing: social, physical, emotional, economic, cultural and spiritual.
- **B)** <u>analyse</u> impacts these factors have had on the interviewees overall wellbeing throughout their life span.

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- the interview plan/questions;
- the recorded notes taken during the interviews (these may be written or verbal/recorded); and
- the concluding report.

Demonstrate your knowledge and understanding of the topic 'Wellbeing'. The presentation of interview questions, recorded notes and the report.
