New Administration Building and Carpark Access

Exciting news that our new Administration building is set for handover at the end of this term. The building will be 'home' for the Senior Executive, Head Teacher Administration and many of our School Administration staff. The building has many meeting rooms and saves our community from having to walk through the school to access the office.

The staff carpark will have gates for staff and school deliveries only. Parents are to drop off and pick up their children on Goobarabah Avenue during morning and afternoon peak times. At non-peak times, 9.30~am-2.30~pm parents are able to park at the top of the bus road to conduct business at the school.

All student entry and exit at the front of the school will be through the gate near the new building. The pedestrian gate near the carpark will be closed.

Uniform

Students are required to wear full school uniform at all times. This is a requirement for the safety of our students so they are easily identifiable on our school grounds and in our community. Please ensure if your child is unable to wear uniform for any reason that they have a note explaining why.

The cold weather has well and truly hit, school jumpers are available at the uniform shop.

Three reasons for wearing school uniform:

Safety: When all of our students are in uniform, intruders are easy to identify. People who come into the school without permission, often to act aggressively towards our students, are easily spotted and controlled.

Pride: Our uniform engenders a sense of belonging to the school and identification with the school. A positive school spirit is a great aid in learning. Students who have a positive attitude to their school, who approach it with pride, respect and enjoyment are those who will look back on their school days with pleasure and fondness.

Community Confidence: Our school is judged by the outside community, not only on its academic results or its sporting prowess but on the image it presents - the standards of dress and conduct of its students. A negative impression in the eyes of the public demeans our students.

Our P & C supports Gorokan High School in complying with the Department of Education rules on core discipline. These rules state that students must "maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's **uniform** or **dress code**".

Cyber Safety / Awareness

Please ensure your children are safe on line by using the appropriate filters and supervision on your home internet. It is all too easy for our kids to unwittingly get caught up giving out personal information over the internet. Simple things like 'tagging' and 'checking in' via Facebook can give undesirables their current location potentially putting them at risk of harm.

It is also very important that students do not send or 'post' inappropriate images of themselves and others. The laws around this type of behaviour are very strict and unfortunately, once these images are sent you no longer have control over what happens with them nor who gets to see them.

Graphic Novels

Our collection of Graphic Novels is constantly expanding and is in high demand. The term Graphic Novel refers to the format of a book, not a genre. Graphic novels can be fiction or non-fiction, or anything in-between.

Graphic novels are similar to comic books because they use sequential images to tell a story. Many of our graphic novels are in the "Manga" category which is the Japanese word for comic. "Manga" is read from top to bottom and right to left as this is the traditional Japanese reading pattern.

A few of our popular titles this term are Kamisama Kiss, Big Nate and Tokyo Ghoul.

Borrowing

Years 7 – 10 may borrow 2 fiction and 2 nonfiction books.

Years 11 – 12 may borrow 6 fiction and 6 nonfiction books plus textbooks that are required for course work.

Most books may be borrowed for 2 weeks and can be renewed if required. Books may be returned between 8:00am and 2.35pm to the return box in the library foyer.

Students with overdue books will be unable to borrow until the overdue books are returned. If library books are lost or misplaced, please let us know so we can inform your student of the price and arrange for payment at the front office.

World Book Online

GHS now subscribes to World Book online. It is very much like the World Book Encyclopaedia except digital. It is user friendly and suitable for all high school age groups.

The World Book Web includes several reference sites that feature:

A vast collection of primary source documents, thousands of editor-selected Web sites, research tools, including a timeline and citation builder, current magazine and newspaper selections.

Students can make individual accounts to save their research into for future use.

As part of the process I teach them how to professionally layout their applications and how to update them in the future.

The Subject Expo Night

This was held for year 8 and year 10 students and their parents, on 16th May and was once again very well attended. It was a very successful school community function.

Thanks must go to Helene Jacobs, who co-ordinated the night and to all the staff for their efforts in setting up the hall, preparing the displays and information leaflets as well as making themselves available to speak with students and parents on the night.

We also appreciate that representatives from the University of Newcastle, TAFE, State Training, Youth Connections and Central Coast Group Training were able to attend.

This night has been followed by Senior Subject Selection Interviews, for year 10 students and their parents. SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORT SCHEME

School Student Travel

Students travelling on public transport may be eligible for free travel between home and school under the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS). For more details or to apply for the School Opal card please visit www.transportnsw.info/school-students or call 131 500.

Students travelling on school or public buses must have a valid ticket for every trip. Ticketing options include School, Child or Youth Opal cards; otherwise a cash fare (from \$1.30) must be purchased. Opal cards must be tapped on and off for every trip.

If your School Opal card shows an error when you tap on or off, you need to contact the Opal helpline on 131 500. Common School Opal card error codes include:

- 53 invalid card
- 65 card is not valid on Coastal Liner services
- 70, 72 or 73 not valid for travel at current time or day
