# **Principal's Report**

It has been a very busy start to Semester 2, with some excellent opportunities for students. There has been a large number of excursions across all key learning areas, Year 6 students have been attending their 'taster' days so they gain an understanding of how High School works. Year 12 have completed their Trial HSC exams and Year 11 are working toward completing their Preliminary year. In sport we have had a number of outstanding achievements with our Girls Under 16 Rugby League team playing in the State Finals once again this year.

### Secondary Schools Renewal Project

Our new administration block has been completed and is in use. The building has been completed on time and is extremely well presented. The new Bus Bay area is also excellent with a modern look and creates a safe and dry place for our students to wait for the bus each afternoon.

There is still some work going on in the old Administration building to finalise the changes being made but the new Learning Support Hub has opened and is running well.

# Department of Education Behaviour Code for Students

I have once again attached to this newsletter the Department of Education Behaviour Code for students. It clearly outlines what the expectations are for students when attending school. I have pointed out a few of the main issues for us below.

### Late to School / Class

Gorokan High School starts at 8.25am. Students are expected to be in roll call at this time. Students arriving after this time require a note from home indicating the reason for their partial absence. If students do not have a note they are required to complete a consequence for the lateness.

Similarly if students are late to class they will be required to complete a consequence. Unfortunately many students are taking too long to move between classes or from the playground to class after breaks. Recess and lunch time are designated times for use of the toilets.

### Uniform

Students are required to wear full school uniform at all times. This is a requirement for the safety of our students so they are easily identifiable on our school grounds and in our community. Please ensure if your child is unable to wear uniform for any reason that they have a note explaining why.

### Cyber / Mobile device Safety

Students and parents are reminded that information, pictures and videos they post on the internet and send via text message and apps like 'snap chat' must be free from any inappropriate material. Sending provocative or sexually explicit photos of minors is an offence. It does not matter if you have the person's permission or even if that person is yourself.

Mr Andrew Collins who has been successful in gaining a position as Relieving Deputy Principal at Lisarow High School. Although we are unsure of the complete duration of this position we envisage the position will extend into 2019 and possibly beyond. # WELLBEING AT GHS

#### General Attendance at Gorokan High School

Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

Being sick or having an infectious disease

Being required to attend a recognized religious holiday
Exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

# **Careers News**

### Year 12

The Careers and Transition team, along with the rest of the staff, wish year 12 all the best in their exams and for their future.

On the 4th August the University Admissions Centre (UAC) opened for students to apply for 2017 courses. Students should have registered by now, to take advantage of paying the reduced "on time fee". They can then go back on line at any time to alter their preferences.

After their exams Year 12 students are still welcome to come to the school to access the Careers Resource Room, to use a computer with internet access so they can do career related research and have assistance with writing job applications and resumes.

### **RSA and RCG Courses**

Many Year 12 students took advantage of being able to do these courses at a reduced price through the school. This qualification allows them to be eligible to work in an establishment where alcohol is served, so provides them with more options of places to work once they are 18 years of age.

### Year 10

After their yearly exams all Year 10 students will be doing the following *compulsory courses for being enrolled into year 11* –"All My Own Work" and "Work Ready" and the "Cross Roads" programs.

All Year 10 students have received their notification about doing Work Experience from 27th November to 8th December. They have been out sourcing a place, and their personal detail forms and initial host employer forms were due back on 21st August. If they have not been returned yet, please make sure you follow this up.

This is an invaluable opportunity, as students who participate in this activity develop more on-the-job employment skills and therefore have an increased chance of gaining fulltime employment when they leave school. After completion of work experience, the details should be added to their resumes.

### **Resumes and Job Applications**

# Year 12 News

Here is some important information and dates for year 12 in the lead up to their final weeks here at school and for the HSC exams.

A letter has been sent out to all families inviting you to the Year 12 graduation ceremony. This will be in the old hall here at school beginning at 9 am. Students MUST be in full school uniform with a rehearsal conducted Thursday 21 September and the graduation ceremony on Friday 22 September. There is no need to RSVP for this event and I look forward to as many parents, carers and family members attending as possible to celebrate the achievement of completing formal schooling.

Monday October 16 is the official start date of the HSC exams. These are held off site at the Toukley 50+ Club (near Coles). A site visit has been arranged for Monday 4 November at 8am to orient students on where to go and the procedures that they can expect during their exams. Students are asked to make their own way there on this morning and at the conclusion, normal classes will commence and they are expected to attend school as normal. An exam time table can be found at the NESA website for the HSC and students should have this printed out and be aware well in advance of their scheduled exam.
