All students and staff were played an excerpt of the speech after the acknowledgement of country and didge performance. All students and staff were then informed about the significance of the speech and the relationships and potential this creates for all people of Australia.

We also had Year 7 & 8 students participate in the "Ab Ed Get To Know You Day" on Monday 1st March which was a great day for all staff and students involved.

CORE FACULTY TERM 1 2021

The Core faculty is looking forward to working with your child in 2021 to help them maximise their learning outcomes. In terms of staffing within the faculty we have Mr Moore, Mr Costa, Mr Bennett, Ms Selby-Smith, Mr McNamara and Ms McRae. Below is an outline of the subjects that each teacher delivers:

Mr. Moore- Humanities

Mr. Costa- Humanities and Science and Language and Culture (Banal Ngaruga-dhi);

Mr. Bennett- Language (Japanese);

Ms. Selby-Smith- Humanities, Language and Culture (Banal Ngaruga-dhi), Language (Japanese), PD/H/PE and Maths;

Mr. McNamara- Humanities, Language and Culture (Banal Ngaruga-dhi), Science, PD/H/PE and Maths; and

Ms. McRae- Humanities, Language and Culture (Banal Ngaruga-dhi) and Language (Japanese).

It has certainly been a very busy term and it has been great getting to know the new Year 7 cohort.

Humanities

The Core faculty is excited to be teaching the Humanities program in 2021 after a COVID disrupted 2020 meant that we were not able to deliver it to its full extent.

What is Humanities?

Humanities is a blend of three subjects; English, History and Geography. Each subject area's outcomes have been combined to produce exit outcomes which can be linked back to the outcomes of each subject area. Humanities is taught conceptually, meaning that each of the four units of work are taught through a conceptual lens. The four units of work we will be studying this year are;

Term 1- Value:

Term 2- Empowerment;

Term 3- Liveability and

Term 4- Connections.

One of the main benefits of the Humanities program is that your child will have one less teacher and more face to face contact with their Humanities teacher (11 periods per fortnight) in which to build a strong rapport. As always, we encourage an open line of communication between school and home. If you have any questions or wish to talk to your child's Humanities teacher please call the school and we will get back to you.

Students will be assessed by the completion of three tasks for Humanities in 2021. These are:

Task 1- Humanities Portfolio (classwork including; map work, critical reading, creative writing and book work);

Task 2- Empowerment Task (historical source analysis and the creation of a storyboard); and

Task 3- Poetry Anthology.

The school has purchased a license for Year 7 for an amazing online literacy program called *WordFlyers*. WordFlyers is an engaging, interactive and self-paced platform that focuses on the development of reading, comprehension, spelling, writing, punctuation, grammar and vocabulary skills. All students now have logins and have started working their way through the program in class. Students are also encouraged to use this program at home as much as they like. No longer will the excuse of 'I have no homework' be applicable! You should have received a letter with login details that your child was asked to take home. If you did not get this please contact your child's Humanities teacher for your letter.

Silent Reading

In the classroom students have enjoyed the Silent Reading program. At the beginning of every lesson students engage in 10 minutes of reading for pleasure using a book or magazine of their choosing. Whilst most students are bringing in reading material, some are still not. We encourage all students to bring a text that is of interest to them. They may borrow from the school library at any time and we encourage all students to bring to school reading material from home.

Banal Ngaruga-dhi

On your child's timetable you may have noticed the subject code 'LAC'. This stands for 'Language and Culture'. Gorokan High School is excited to implement, in partnership with the NSW Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG), one of the first localised Aboriginal Curriculums for Year 7 students in the state. Twice a cycle, students will engage in the program, called *Banal Ngaruga-dhi* (which means 'The Sun is Rising'). The focus on Banal Ngaruga-dhi is to allow students to learn about the rich culture and language of the first inhabitants of this area, the Darkinjung people.

The teachers of this program have been lucky enough to engage in some excellent 'On-Country' professional learning late last year and earlier this term. All staff involved in the program from Senior Executive to classroom

teachers have undertaken Dr. Shayne Williams' 'Healthy Culture, Healthy Country' workshops and have had the privilege of going out to some sites around Mount Yengo, led by Uncle David Ella who has kindly shared some of his extensive knowledge and passion for Aboriginal culture. Our plan is to get all students out this year 'On-Country' so that they can increase their understanding of local Aboriginal culture in a context that no classroom can provide.



TAS Term 1 2021


