Students enjoyed designing their own flavour combinations whilst producing mini pizza scrolls, boba (bubble) tea, cookie ice cream sandwiches, fully loaded wedges, Mexican taco bowls, cheesecakes and sushi. Students designed and produced a movie snack for their assessment task. Some highlights included iced cookies to promote Fast n Furious, stuffed potatoes to promote Toy Story, beach themed cupcakes to promote Moana and a cake to promote 'Top Gun'.





10X Food Technology



In Term 4 we studied Food Service and Catering including the functional properties of food. For the assessment task students designed and produced a food item demonstrating a functional property of food to be sold at a music festival from a food truck. Some highlights included crème brulee, naan bread and quesadillas. Students then were asked what they would like to make to finish the year. We prepared katsu don pork and egg rice bowls, pork wontons, hamburgers, and Christmas sweet treats.
